JEFFREY BOND, MSc

Jeffrey Bond is a surficial geologist and manager with the Yukon Geological Survey. Over the past 28 years, Mr. Bond has had the privilege of exploring many remote corners of Yukon in his goal to unravel its recent geological history. Bond's research projects have spanned both the glaciated and unglaciated landscapes in the Territory. Projects have included reconstructing the glacial history of areas such as Whitehorse, the Pelly Mountains, the Big Salmon Range, Keno Silver District, White River area and early Pleistocene (2 Ma) glacial deposits along the Stewart River. Other projects have included collaborative drift prospecting projects with the Geological Survey of Canada and soil geochemistry studies in a variety of terrains. Over the last 10 years Bond has shifted his focus towards Yukon placer geology and together with his team is responsible for documenting the geology and work history at more than 160 placer mines. Mr. Bond completed his BSc in physical geography at the University of Calgary and holds an MSc in geomorphology from the University of Alberta.
