Current research is using isotopes and trace-element geochemistry on base metal indicator minerals for provenance and mineral-type tracing in glaciated terrain. Also is researching the long-distance glacial transport of indicator minerals by fast flowing ice (ice streams) and the application of micromorphology for till-forming processes.
